The board fully supports the Spirit of Arcadia: Building for the Future campaign which is now beginning. Toward the latter portion of our meeting, these two questions about the Spirit of Arcadia campaign were posed to the board: "Are we together in this?" and "Are we in this together?" The answer to both questions is a resounding, 'YES!' Some revisions to the plans for the stabilization of the beachfront were accepted and are available for you to explore in this newsletter and on Camp Arcadia's website. The plans are really exciting to see. This first stage of the campaign will encompass the beachfront stabilization, a rebuilding of the central patio, the caretaker's storage building, updated and expanded laundry and kitchen facilities and the enclosure of the north end of the Inn.

Plans are in the early development stage for celebrating Camp's 100th anniversary in 2022. If you have ideas to share about this celebration, please share them with Executive Director, Chip May.

LEGACY BUILDER STORY: ANDY WYETH

I vividly remember my first encounter with Camp Arcadia. I was sitting with my cousins at our Grandma's; we were just 10 years old. I remember asking about the beaded necklaces they were wearing, ones they had made in the craft shop at Camp. They answered by describing the different activities, buildings, people, and programs. As soon as I heard them describe it, I knew I had to go.

That first year I had the privilege of meeting Pastor Yonker who served as our summer staff Chaplain. Our first conversation focused around my Christian upbringing or lack thereof. Pastor Yonker made it very clear that he and this experience as part of Camp's staff would give me the opportunity to be part of the family of God and would allow me to feel comfortable exploring my relationship with God. This was the moment I knew Camp would play a significant part in the rest of my life.

During that first summer on staff, I had many meaningful experiences, one of which was meeting my future wife. We were married at Camp Arcadia because of the amazing memories, opportunities and relationships we made at Camp. We also wanted others to experience this place we loved.

When a friend explained what Legacy Builders were and how they contributed to Camp's future and ministry, I couldn't think of a better way to give back to the place that had blessed my wife and me in so many ways.

As a recently married couple, my wife and I didn't have a lot of disposable income to put forth as our contribution. SPIRIT OF ARCADIA: BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE UPDATE

Last November, the LCA membership voted overwhelmingly to move forward with The Spirit of Arcadia Campaign to implement Camp's master site plan. We are excited to begin this journey to secure the future of Camp's ministry so that future generations will be able to enjoy the traditions of family, faith and friends at Camp Arcadia. We have spent the months since getting ready to launch the campaign and refining the conceptual plans for Stage One - Securing the Future. This stage includes the following:

STAGE ONE: SECURING THE FUTURE

Beach Preservation Project - \$1.7 million Inn East Renovations: Kitchen & Laundry - \$500,000 North Inn Stairs Enclosure & New Patio - \$150,000 Caretaker's Storage Building - \$100,000

Estimated Total - \$2.5 million

STAGE TWO: GROWING THE COMMUNITY includes the Inn lodging expansion with a new parking lot, an elevator, 10 new rooms and a third floor observation room. It is estimated to cost around \$2.5 million. This stage will have it's own capital campaign and will follow stage one. The timeline for when this stage will begin depends on the success and speed of the campaign to achieve stage one's objectives.

CONCEPTUAL PLAN UPDATE

We have been working with SmithGroup JJR, the beach engineering and landscape architecture firm, on refining the beach plan. We plan to submit a permit application to the State of Michigan this spring. SmithGroup JJR has also been working with us to tie the beach plan in with the other building and site plan changes. In the updated plan there are changes that reflect feedback from guests and insights from the engineering firm and staff, but the major goals and features of the plan have not changed: a rock revetment to protect our buildings from rising water and beach erosion, two pocket beaches to provide beach access even in high water, increased lakefront viewing area, additional kitchen, laundry and storage space, and an enclosed north Inn stairwell to provide an additional access to the Inn's second floor.

The updated plan better fits with the look and feel of Camp Arcadia, less concrete and more natural features. The pocket



beach, or Sunset Beach as we are calling it, was moved a bit to the north to give it some separation from the Chapel on the Beach and a universally accessible walkway was added. A designated fire pit area was also included. Instead of a larger concrete patio that extended out to the west, we've added a boardwalk and additional decking along the lakeshore and a sandy area behind the boardwalk. This sandy area will be a wonderful place for people to relax and recreate as it will connect to the playground area.

We are working with our building architectural firm, Cornwell Architects, on further developing the conceptual drawings for the the Inn east addition which include the kitchen, laundry and north Inn stairs enclosure.

SPIRIT OF ARCADIA CAMPAIGN UPDATE

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We are excited to announce that The Spirit of Arcadia Campaign is underway. In March we began with training around 25 volunteers from across the midwest. We are excited to announce Paul & Kelly Culler of Waldo, OH as the Steering Committee Chairs. Paul and Kelly have been coming to Camp Arcadia for more than 20 years. Their daughter Katie, will serve as the Trading Post manager this summer. Paul serves on the Lutheran Camp Association's Board of Directors. The Cullers will be spending more time in Arcadia this summer, as they have recently purchased a home on Star-Key Point in Arcadia. We give thanks to God for passionate volunteers that will help make The Spirit of Arcadia Campaign a success.

As we begin the campaign our goal is to meet with as many members of the Camp Arcadia community as possible. This will take the form of individual meetings and group gatherings this spring, summer and fall. The goal for stage one of the campaign is to raise \$2.5 million. The financial goals that need to be met before we start with construction include 50% of the cash on hand and 90% of the \$2.5 million pledged. The Camp is also committed to not taking on debt for more than 5 years. The earliest we could start construction, if these goals were met, would be the fall of 2018.

This is an exciting time for Camp Arcadia. Please keep the Camp staff, volunteers, and supporters in your prayers as we carry out the Spirit of Arcadia Campaign. If you would like to learn more visit Camp's website and look for updates in our e-newsletter.

ANNUAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

We are excited to announce that we not only met but exceeded our 2016 Annual Campaign goal! Last year's goal was \$175,000. **With your generous support we ended up raising a total of \$214,000.** We give thanks to God for Camp Arcadia's ministry and our passionate and generous supporters. You can take pride in knowing that you helped Camp Arcadia continue to thrive as a place of rest and renewal for families and individuals. Thank you so much for your commitment to Camp Arcadia's ministry.

Your generous support allows Camp Arcadia to make improvements to the buildings, grounds, and programs, as well as offer financial assistance to those in need. Last year we were able to enlarge and refurbish Juniper cottage's first-floor bathroom, renovate the lakeside staff rooms in the Wigwam, put a new roof on Juniper cottage, improve electrical systems in the craft shop and give financial scholarships. The money given in excess of the annual goal will be reinvested in Camp Arcadia's ministry.

The 2017 annual campaign goal is \$175,000. Your investment helps to insure that the Arcadia experience remains affordable, while helping us provide life-changing experiences for more than 3,000 guests each year. This year's projects include: renovating Cedar cottage, repairing women's shower room tile, upgrade Juniper 2nd floor bathroom and kitchen, renovating the Assembly coffee lobby, installing new blinds in the Assembly, adding a larger ice maker in the Inn coffee lobby and getting new floor runners for the 2nd floor of the Inn.

MESSAGE FROM CHIP

Do you know your why? Why do you do what you do? Simon Sinek, author of the book *Start with Why*, explores the Why. He says, "Very few people or companies can clearly articulate WHY they do WHAT they do. By WHY I mean your purpose, cause or belief - WHY does your company exist? WHY do you get out of bed every morning? And WHY should anyone care? People don't buy WHAT you do, they buy WHY you do it." He goes on to say, "All organizations start with WHY, but only the great ones keep their WHY clear year after year."

We are blessed at Camp Arcadia to have a clear mission and 95 years of history and traditions that remind us why we do what we do. But, as Camp Arcadia grows and changes it is important that we continually remind ourselves why Camp Arcadia exists. I want to tell you a story from this last summer that reminded me of Camp's why.

During our Omega Teen Retreat for high school students we experienced a transformative worship experience that began a new tradition. Jess McCallum, our new program director, designed a Prayer Around the Cross worship that brought 160 teens and 60 staff to the patio following evening vespers. We silently filed out of the Round Up to the patio where everyone surrounded a cross made up of wooden boxes filled with sand. The staff and teens sang songs and placed lit candles in the sand boxes. Jess had done a lot of work to plan and organize the event so that is was orderly and a meaningful worship experience around the cross of Jesus. Which it was. But it was also more than we had hoped for. The groups were to send a few kids to the cross with candles and then they were to return to their group. Well, they didn't return. They sat down at the cross and more kids joined them, until we had almost all of Camp, sitting around the cross with candles blazing, singing, praying and celebrating the love we find in Jesus and in a community of believers.

In my over 25 years of Camp Arcadia teen retreats I had never experienced a more powerful worship experience. I saw Camp's why in the faces of those teens as they sang and prayed.

It reminded me that things can change at Camp Arcadia, but God's spirit will always be present here. God will continue to show His love through the Arcadia community and I hope you will be here to be a part of it. Thank you for your prayers and support as we embark on Camp's 95th season.

FALL CONFIRMATION RETREATS

Camp Arcadia has the amazing opportunity to engage with confirmation age youth and their adult leaders during the fall retreat season; starting with two retreats in 2013 and growing to offer four retreats in 2017, this is an exciting ministry opportunity at Camp!

Research shows that an experience at camp has a "positive and lasting impact that extends well beyond the week at camp. These impacts are clear and recognizable in camps that are intentionally Christ-centered, relational, participatory, safe and different from home." (Vibrant Faith Research 2016).

Coming to Camp as a part of a church's confirmation program allows students to step out of their normal routine, at home and church, and experience a weekend set apart for fun and faith development. The experience students share with their peers and adult leaders provides a lasting foundation for all.

"I didn't have any friends in confirmation who were coming and I am leaving with a new friend." - Student Participant Joining together around God's Word, sharing in laughter around ice cream and eating a family style meal meal as a congregational group generates memories and experiences that impact the student's confirmation experience.

Camp Arcadia plans the programming and allows for adult leaders to experience the retreat along side the students. These common experiences and shared spaces as a Christian community offer the opportunity to build meaningful relationships rooted in the Gospel of Jesus Christ. As a community on these weekend's, all dive into God's Word together, hear the Gospel of Christ proclaimed, sing praises to God's name and share in laughter and games. The staff of the retreat work to balance learning and fellowship through an engaging schedule with games, bible study, free time, congregational time and more.
