FACILITIES

Camp Arcadia is nestled on the shores of Lake Michigan – surrounded by beautiful forests and small town living. With the simple charms of a resort built in the 1920s, Camp's setting invites guests to disconnect from the hustle and bustle of everyday life in order to reconnect with God and each other.

Enjoy your morning cup of coffee on the front porch accompanied by sweeping lakefront views, play all day in Northern Michigan summer temperatures (70-80*), watch God's artistry in the sky as you watch the sunset over Lake Michigan, and feel the lake breeze through your window as you drift off to sleep. Camp Arcadia gives you the opportunity to enjoy the beauty of God's creation to the fullest with your family and friends.

Camp Arcadia is set on 110 acres of lakefront and woodland property, nestled in northwestern Michigan dune and orchard country. Our facilities include a basketball court, tennis courts, a baseball/soccer field, a low ropes course, a Craft Shop, nature activities, hiking trails, shuffleboard courts, and an

expanse of shoreline for exploring and enjoying. Camp's three main buildings are located around a central patio area on the Lake Michigan shoreline. All buildings have ramps and are universally accessible.

Many guests stay in the Inn, which houses 44 rooms as well as the dining room where most meals are served. Guests may also choose to stay in one of the five Camp-owned cottages located about a block from Camp Arcadia. For more detailed information about our facilities, please visit our website.

DINING

Sharing meals with friends and family will be a highlight of your stay at Camp Arcadia. As the community gathers together around tables in our dining room each day, guests are renewed in body and spirit, sharing good food and great conversation. Many meals are served family style and feature fresh local produce and locally raised meats, alongside healthy sides and delightful desserts. We are able to fully accommodate several dietary restrictions, serving guests who are gluten free, nut

free, and vegetarian, however, due to the nature of Camp's meal service, we are unable to eliminate cross contamination. At Camp Arcadia, we do all the work so you get to enjoy and relax!

PROGRAMMING

Camp Arcadia's programming is family-centered and has something fun for everyone! The wide array of activities offered daily can keep even the most active family member busy all day long. With the opportunity to choose how much (or how little) to participate in each day, Camp is the perfect fit for every member of your family. Each week features a pair of "deans" who are spiritual leaders for the week, offering daily Bible studies for adults and lead the community in worship.

At Camp Arcadia, you're invited to play tennis, kayak, enjoy the beach and Lake Michigan, hike, bike, play games and organized sports, golf at nearby championship courses, shop in local resort towns, visit area sights like Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore, watch the sunset over the lake, enjoy ice cream at Camp Arcadia's Trading Post, and relax or read a

book on one of our Adirondack chairs next to the lake.

Worship is an integral part of each Camp Arcadia experience. Whether you're here for a weekend or a longer retreat, you will have the opportunity to worship at our Chapel on the Beach, an outdoor worship space overlooking Lake Michigan.

Camp Arcadia offers a variety of programming throughout each season including family weeks, teen weeks, and fall retreats catering to confirmands, older adults (50+), men's and women's groups. We also offer Respite Care for guests with special needs and their families during some retreats. (Reach out to Camp for more information!)

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

HOW TO REGISTER FOR CAMP ARCADIA

Registration for Camp Arcadia's 2026 Season opens on December 1, 2025. To register, you must complete and submit your registration form either online or by returning your paper registration form (included at the end of this brochure) to Camp Arcadia.

There are three ways you may submit your registration form:

- You can submit your registration form online by visiting camp-arcadia.com.
- You can send your completed paper registration form via mail to PO Box 229, Arcadia, MI 49613.
- 3. You can return your paper registration form to the Camp Arcadia office in person.

All retreats are filled on a first come, first served basis, with the exception of Camp Arcadia's Family Week Retreats. Camp Arcadia does not accept registration forms via fax, email or text.

The priority registration deadline is January 5, 2026.

Each year, many of the Family Week Retreats are filled to maximum capacity with a waitlist of families hoping to secure their spot. Due to the high volume of requests for these retreats, Camp Arcadia conducts Family Week Retreat registration as a drawing. Please see the section below for more details. (Note: generally, Family Week Retreats in July and early August are in highest demand.)

Note: The paper registration form included with this brochure may be used to register for any Camp retreat with the exclusion of Fall Confirmation Retreats. To register for Family Weeks, Summer Starter, Lutherhostel and Labor Day Weekend, use one form **per household**. For Teen Retreats, Men's Retreats and Women's Retreats, please use one form **per person**.

THE DRAWING FOR FAMILY WEEK RETREATS

When registration opens on December 1, 2025, both LCA member and non-member registration forms for Camp Arcadia's Family Week Retreats will be accepted, but LCA members are given priority within the drawing process. Only registration forms submitted and/or postmarked by the priority deadline, January 5, 2026, will be included in the drawing.

After we have received all registrations sent by the priority deadline of January 5, we fill each Family Week Retreat to 75% capacity with LCA members before we return to fill remaining spots.

We will email you the results of your registration request by February 11, 2026. If you get in, your deposit will be processed. If you do not get in, you will be placed on a waitlist and your deposit will not be processed.

Participation in this registration drawing does not guarantee that you will be registered for a retreat at Camp Arcadia. We try our best to accommodate as many guests as possible.

LCA MEMBERSHIP AND PRIORITY REGISTRATION

One of the perks of Lutheran Camp Association (LCA) membership is priority registration. However, your membership does not guarantee that your family will get into a retreat at Camp Arcadia.

SENDING FORMS AFTER JANUARY 5. 2026

All registration requests submitted online or postmarked after January 5, 2026 will be processed in the order that they are received. If all the retreats on your registration form are full, we will not process your deposit and will place you on the waitlist. Depending on the volume of registrations we receive, we expect to notify you about your status within 7-10 business days after February 11, 2026 or after you submit your registration form (if after February 11).

WAITLIST

Guests who are not accommodated through the registration process will be placed on waitlists for all retreats listed under "retreat preferences" on their submitted registration form. To ensure the security of your financial information, we will not retain your deposit payment information if you are put on a waitlist. Upon being moved off of the waitlist and into a retreat, we will call to collect payment information for the full deposit amount to be paid at that time.

GROUP RESERVATIONS DURING FAMILY WEEKS

Multi-family groups are welcome to register together for Family Week Retreats. Groups of up to 30 people from more than one mailing address wishing to attend the same week are considered "Group Reservations." To make a Group Reservation, follow the following steps.

- 1. Select a Group Contact Person. This person will act as liaison and coordinator between the Camp Office and the members of the group.
- 2. Submit your registrations by the priority deadline (January 5, 2026) as follows: either enclose all registration forms together in one envelope and mail them together OR submit separately, indicating the Group Contact Person on each registration form (either by mail or online). Please note that the Group Contact Person should be the same person on all forms for the group.

Group Reservations are most easily accommodated in the weeks earlier or later in the summer. If LCA members wish to submit a group reservation, all families included in the group reservation must be LCA members to receive the LCA membership priority registration.

ADDITIONAL IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- To increase the likelihood of getting into Camp Arcadia for a Family Week Retreat, please provide multiple options in the Retreat Preference section of your registration form.
- Confirmation emails will be sent when possible, so please include a working email address on your registration form.
- Vacation rates are for the entire retreat. Late arrivals, early departures or missed meals do not reduce the cost.
- During Family Week Retreats and Labor Day Retreat, teens 15
 years and older will be housed with other teens as space allows,
 unless parents request otherwise. Males are usually housed in
 the Assembly dorm, and females are housed in Inn rooms.
- Room assignments are made according to your needs; we make every effort to ensure your comfort and grant your preference.
 Consideration is given to the number of people in your party, bed space and health needs.
- Most retreats will run from Sunday afternoon through the next Saturday morning. Your confirmation letter will contain additional details on check-in and check-out times.

CANCELLATIONS & CHANGES TO RESERVATIONS

Please notify the Camp Office immediately of any changes or cancellations.

Cancellation Policy for May - August Retreats:

- Cancellations before March 15: Your full deposit will be refunded.
- Cancellations between March 15 and May 15th: A \$100 cancellation fee per person will be applied.
- Cancellations after May 15: The cancellation fee is equal to the full minimum deposit.

Cancellation Policy for September - October Retreats:

- Cancellations before August 1: Your full deposit will be refunded.
- Cancellation after August 1: The cancellation fee is equal to the full minimum deposit; your deposit can be transferred to another guest if housing allows.
- Cancellations for Fall Confirmation Retreats should contact the Camp Office.

COMMON SENSE AND UNCOMMON SENSIBILITY

Our senses—hearing, seeing, tasting, smelling, and touching—are gifts to fortify our faith and beautify our lives with practical wisdom.
